1. Michelle Pong reported that there is a resident that is planning on living on Center Pond Road year round. David Vaillancourt said he would need a turn-around in order to turn around the plow truck. He estimates the cost at %\$10,000.

1. Dale Smith submitted a building permit to Harry Power for consideration.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Covid-19 issues – Angel Nicoletti asked if the town would be paying for any employee

that is exposed to Covid-19 – answer is yes.

- 2. Broadband Fibercast is working on installation of wiring for supplying boardband to outlying areas of the town.
- 3. King's Highway Update Michelle read an update on King's Highway project the engineers are designing a cast-in-place option for a twin culvert replacement. They expect to hold a 3 week bid period to expedite the project. The expect to commence construction this year.
- Shed at Transfer Station Share Shed option Michelle asked it the Selectmen wish to save the current building to provide a structure for sharing usable items. The Selectmen were open to the idea.

## NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Election/Ballot procedures Karen Bell explained the procedure and reported that there were 504 ballots in the box, which was labeled as 500 ballots. She is planning on careful recording of all ballots casted.
- 2. Trick or Treat Town Government involvement? No
- New Keys/Locks for Gould House and Town Hall there seems to be a lot of keys but the board thought a code entrance system would be better. Then the town would have a record of all people entering the buildings. Steve McGerty said the system would probably cost \$1000.00.
- 4. ADA Ramp at Town Hall Bob Fee moved and Chris Madden seconded to install a cement ramp leading to the Gould House door, the board approved.
- 5. Tag Sale Ordinance Due to several complaints received about the tag sale on Route 123, the board decided to draft an ordinance to be presented at the next town meeting. The town would have to vote the ordinance into law.
- 6. Library use of Town Hall November 24<sup>th</sup> for the library to use the Town Hall because the Conservation Commission is holding their meetings via zoom virtually.
- 7. Budget Schedule the board approved the budget schedule as drafted.

# OTHER CORRESPONDENCE:

1. Steve Rockwell reported that he has been nicknamed the Bread Man due to his having free food from the New Hampshire Food Bank to share with town residents. He picks up about 20 containers of food which he then has available for pickup at the Fire Station on Saturday mornings. All residents are allowed to go to the Fire Station and toot their horn and a volunteer will bring out a container for their use.
