SELECTMEN'S MEETING MINUTES

November 23, 2020

The meeting opened at 7:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendees included Christopher Madden, Chairman of Selectmen, Robert Fee, Selectman, Steve McGerty, Selectman, Michelle Pong, Town Administrator, Harry Power, Compliance Officer and Patricia Putnam, Administrative Assistant. Several members of the public attended.

APPOINTMENTS:

7:00 - Harry Power - Building Permits

Tax Map # 126, Lot # 41, Christopher & Jennifer Hahn, 91 Shedd Hill Road, partial addition and deck, approved.

SELECTMEN'S COMMENTS:

- 1. Steve McGerty read a letter thanking the taxpayers, residents and Selectmen for electing him for the third time as a Selectman.
- 2. Steve McGerty said the town should not be issuing building permits because we do not have a building inspector. Harry Power said the town does not have Building Codes and is allowed to issue building permits. The town has used this: "Intent to build" for years and we now enforce the Town Zoning regulations.
- 3. Steve McGerty asked if there was any information on the mailboxes up at Hidden Lake Development. The Marlow Postmaster has ruled that the Town has no authority to move them. He has sent a letter to the mailbox owners about that.
- 4. Chris Madden asked Michelle Pong to check with the NH Municipal Association and the Tax Collectors Association for training to get the staff in the Tax Collector's office trained. Michelle Pong did report that there is one day of training scheduled now.
- 5. Chris Madden reported that he has had several phone complaints on people walking along Protection Road to get to the other end to go hunting and for exercise. The owner of the land on either side of the road is threatening them. Protection Road is a Class VI road. Bob Fee said that Class VI roads can be designated for recreation travel and, with notification to the Fish and Game Department, side by side and recreational vehicle users would not be fined. The Selectmen have to designate which roads will have that distinction. Harry Power said the town should make sure that Class VI roads are available to the public.
- 6. Steve McGerty said there are heavy trucks using Kings Highway, even though it is posted for a limit of 10 tons.
- 7. Bob Fee said there should be a second access to Hidden Lake Development. Chris Madden said the board called for a meeting with management and other department heads to discuss access and no one attended. Bob Fee said the cheapest way to provide a second access it to upgrade Copeland Road or Bridge Hill Road and estimated maybe \$65,000 to do the upgrade.

- 3. King's Highway Update Michelle Pong reported that the bids have been sent out to interested contractors.
- 4. Ratify Advertisement Chris Madden moved and Bob Fee seconded to ratify the ad, the board approved.
- 5. Conservation Commission Appointments The board approved appointments to the Conservation Commission for Geoffrey Jones, Helen Tam-Semmens and Paul Crosby.
- 6. Tag Sale Ordinance Michelle Pong read the change to indicate that there would be no more than 10 days per calendar year for yard/tag sales and that the permit must be obtained 7 days in advance. The proposed ordinance will be sent to Atty. Matt Serge for legal approval. Then there will be a public hearing on it and it will be placed on the Town Warrant for the 2021 Town Meeting.
- 7. Election Invoices Dan Eaton met with the board to explain the invoices that he submitted. Chris Madden approved them.
