JANUARY 27, 2014

The meeting opened at 7:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendees included Arnie Stymest, Selectman, John Halter, Selectman, Stephen McGerty, Selectman Chairman, Harry Power, Compliance Officer, Jim Coffey, Town Administrator, Patricia Putnam, Administrative Assistant, Fire Chief PJ LaMothe and Deputy Fire Chief Joe Sarcione Dean Huber was also present.

APPOINTMENTS:

7:00 - Harry Power - reported that he send a letter to Thumpertown, purchaser of the Rodney Williams property on Valley Road, indicating that the building permit for that Property will expire in July 2014. Harry also noted that he has signed the interrogatory for the Joslyn/Holland issue at the Town Council's direction.

7:30 - Fred Ward - Fred rehashed his complaints once again. Steve McGerty asked what

Fred wanted. He is asking for the resignation of Angel Nicoletti from the ZBA, dismissal

of Sam Bradley as Town Council and apologies from Arnie Stymest and John Halter.

The board took the requests under advisement.

7:45 - Chief La
Mothe, General budget discussion for 2014/15 - met with PJ La
Mothe and

Joe Sarcione concerning the upcoming Fire Department Budget. They reported that the Highway Safety Grant they applied for was denied due to a change in the application

Process. The extrication equipment that they were applying for funding for will be Purchased as they have received the funds from another source.

There has been a change in the National Fire Protection Association guidelines for Fire Department gear. That gear must be replaced every 10 years. That means all pants, coats, gloves, boots and helmets. The old gear must be destroyed. They have gone Through all the gear inventory and destroyed all out of date items. The present gear

was

mostly purchased in 2007 so there is a bit of time before it must be replaced.

The gear replacement costs run:

Firefighter \$2,800, EMS \$1,300, Forestry \$900, Class A Uniform \$400. PJ has been given the name of another supplier that seems to have gear at a more reasonable

price. She will be investigating.

Also, it there is a department staff member who takes a class, the instructor will be checking to verify that all gear is up to date - if not - that person will not be allowed to attend the class.

They also reported that they have been fortunate that one staff member goes to Peterborough and uses that department's washer and dryer. That means the gear is out of service for 2 days versus 2 weeks if it is sent out to be cleaned.

Another concern is that all the airbags are 30 years old. The board discussed the dilemma and concluded there could be a multi-year capital budget warrant article with the same purpose for each year. The report went on to advise that the 12-lead EKG has failed and the leads must be replaced. Another issue is that the Tanker pump must be re-built. This pump is almost 25 years old and the packings are maxed out and cannot be further adjusted. This pump is a front mount one so it will be less costly to work on.

They reported that a dry hydrant has been installed and tested at the Pitcher Mountain Farm pond. Patricia will notify the E911 people of its installation.

Harry Power asked what becomes of the old gear. The answer was that it must be destroyed due to liability if it is used.

Also, they reported that the subject of the executive session held on January 13, 2014 has been resolved and no action was required.
