And we are off, with a very successful kickoff last Monday at the Select Board. Over 50 settlers came out on a cold winter's night to back a petition to form a town, and in turn heard their representatives pass the following resolution

PROCLAMATION

A YEAR TO HONOR THE INCORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF STODDARD, NEW HAMPSHIRE

WHEREAS, on November 4th, 1774, the town of Stoddard was incorporated in honor of Colonel Sampson Stoddard, and other individuals staking a claim for stewardship and community; having formerly been known as Monadnock Number 7 or more locally as Limerick; and

WHEREAS, Stoddard has a rich past founded in a shared history of industry, forestry, agriculture and recreation, nourished by proud and hearty ancestors dedicated to community and cooperation; and

WHEREAS, Stoddard has grown from barely 100 residents in 1900 to over 1,000 permanent full-time residents and another 1,000 seasonal residents that call this place home; and

WHEREAS, for two hundred and fifty years, Stoddard has provided a model of local self-government in the State of New Hampshire to provide for the health, safety, and welfare of its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 2024-01, the Selectboard of the Town of Stoddard deem it appropriate that the Town and its inhabitants shall honor the passage of its Charter, and remember those persons responsible;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Stoddard Select Board, by virtue of the authority vested in us as the Governing Body of the Town of Stoddard, New Hampshire, do hereby proclaim the year of 2024 as "CELEBRATE STODDARD 250" and that the inhabitants of the Town are encouraged to honor this year with a recollection of the Town's history and such celebrations as might be deemed appropriate.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our decree of support on this declaration. Affirmed this 8th day of January 2024.
